INSTALLATION CHECKLIST



Your home just got more efficient! Thank you for participating.

As part of the Neighborhood Energy Efficiency Program, you have received free home improvements. The items checked below indicate which energy-saving improvements were made to your home.

- Switched to Light-Emitting Diode (LED) Bulbs (Standard, Candelabras, Globes, Indoor Recessed and Outdoor Flood). Each LED uses up to 75% less energy than incandescent bulbs and can last up to 10 times longer while yielding the same or better light output.
 Installed Kitchen Faucet Aerator. Swivel and spray kitchen faucet aerators provide additional functionality to your
- faucet and can decrease hot water use by as much as 11% without decreasing faucet pressure. This can save on both water and energy usage.
- Installed Low-Flow Bathroom Faucet Aerator. Low-flow bathroom aerators can reduce a sink's water flow by as much as 30% or more without sacrificing performance. Using warm/hot water takes energy to heat the water, thus cutting down on water usage also cuts down on energy usage.
- Changed HVAC Air Filters. Dirty filters in your heating and air conditioning unit make it work harder and longer to maintain the desired temperature. Replacing filters can save on your energy usage and increase the life expectancy of your system.
- Wrapped Electric Water Heater and Pipes. The insulation installed on your water heater and pipes prevents heat loss from water stored in the tank and on its way to your shower or sink. By insulating both, you can save throughout the year.
- Checked and/or Adjusted Electric Water Heater Temperature. For most homes, reducing the temperature of the water heater from 140 to 120 degrees will save on water heating costs.
- Installed Weatherstripping and Door Sweeps. Weatherstripping and door sweeps improve the energy efficiency of your home by reducing air leaks through doors and windows by sealing the movable connections when the door or window is closed.
- Installed Smart Strip Power Strip. The smart strip power strip features advanced circuitry that not only offers excellent power surge protection, but is actually able to 'sense' the flow of electrical current. The Smart Strip can then turn off selected equipment when it is not in use, therefore creating additional energy savings.
- Installed Low-Flow Shower Head (Wall Mount or Handheld). Low-flow shower heads can decrease water consumption by as much as 40% or more. Showers and baths take energy to heat the water, thus cutting down on water usage also cuts down on energy usage.
- Installed Shower Timer. Switching to a 5-minute shower can cut your water usage almost in half. Showers take energy to heat the water, thus reducing the time in the shower also cuts down on energy usage.
- Installed Digital Switch Plate Thermometer. Nearly half of your energy usage goes to heating and cooling your home. Switch plate thermometers help to better balance heating and air conditioning temperatures from room to room which adds comfort, reduces energy consumption and saves money.
